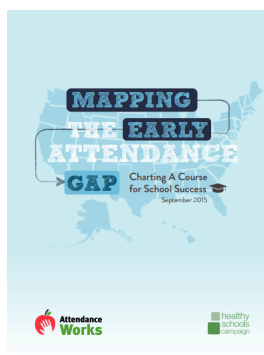

Across the country, an **estimated 5 million to 7.5 million students are missing nearly a month of school** and suffering academically for it.

According to a [new report](#) from Attendance Works and Healthy Schools Campaign, *"This isn't simply a matter of truancy or skipping school. In fact, many of these absences, especially among our youngest students, are excused and tied directly to health factors: asthma and dental problems, learning disabilities, and mental health issues related to trauma and community violence."*



Evidence has long shown that chronic absenteeism is directly linked to poor educational outcomes. In fact, as [Mapping the Early Attendance Gap](#) illustrates "by ninth grade, absenteeism is a better indicator that a student will dropout than eighth grade test scores."

If attendance is so critical and one of the best early warning signs - we have to ask - are we heeding those warnings, and are we doing what it takes to address the underlying challenges? [Mapping the Early Attendance Gap](#) identifies key factors shaping the attendance gap and offers a Five Step Approach for closing that gap.
