1) Promoting Healthy Communities

National Civic Review:

The much anticipated special issue of the National Civic Review celebrating 25 years of Healthy Communities in the U.S. will be published the week of January 27. The winter issue of NCR will chronicle the 25-year history of Healthy Communities and focus on more recent trends and partnerships with articles by J. Michael McGinnis (Institute of Medicine), Joan Twiss (Center for Civic Partnerships), Judith Bell (PolicyLink), Larry Soler (Partnership for a Healthier America), David Fukuzawa (Kresge Foundation) and Stacey Stewart (United Way Worldwide), to name a few. Guest editor Tyler Norris, vice president for Total Health Partnerships at Kaiser Permanente, headed up NCL's Healthy Communities program in the early 1990s.
