## Clear Vision Eau Claire Named Finalist for Public Engagement in Government Award

The Ash Center for Democratic Governance and Innovation at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, <u>recognized Clear Vision Eau Claire as a finalist for the Roy and Lila Ash Innovations in Public Engagement in Government Award</u>.

In 2007, the greater Eau Claire area confronted major fiscal and public-service decisions about funding for over \$400 million in community facilities needs for schools, performing arts facilities, libraries, courthouse expansions, sewer plants, parks, and downtown revitalization. <a href="Partnering with the National Civic League">Partnering with the National Civic League</a>, the group embarked on an inclusive, citizen-centered community visioning and strategic planning process. Over 500 diverse stakeholders were invited to participate in the kickoff to the Clear Vision Eau Claire process, whose mission statement was "to engage our community for the common good." The results in Eau Claire include a community homeless shelter, neighborhood community gardens, youth environmental action teams, and, most recently, approval of a \$70 million, public-private joint venture performing arts center and downtown revitalization project, and future plans for a major events and recreation complex.

<u>Eau Claire</u>, <u>Wisconsin</u> was also named 2014 All-America City with Clear Vision as one of their three winning projects.
