Driver's Responsibility When Stopped

- 1. Turn down radio / at night turn on the dome light.
- Upon request produce your driver's license, registration and proof of insurance.
 Be polite and respectful.
- 4. Do not argue, be calm.
- Keep your hands visible or on the steering wheel.
- 6. Stay in your vehicle unless requested to do otherwise.
- 7. Provide truthful information, failure to do so could result in a ticket or arrest.
- 8. Do not interfere with, touch or obstruct the Police; you could be arrested.
- 9. If you feel your rights are being violated, request for a supervisor to come to the scene.
- 10. If you have a CPL and you are armed, inform the Officer immediately.

Driver's Rights When Stopped

- 1. To have reason for the stop explained, after producing identification.
- To know officers name and badge number.
- To be treated with courtesy and respect.
 To get medical attention, if needed.
- 5. To contest the traffic violation in court, not during the traffic stop.
- In certain cases, your car can be searched without a warrant as long as police have a probable cause.
- 7. If arrested, you have the right to remain silent and talk to a lawyer before talking to the
- police (other than basic information).

- If you feel your rights have been violated, file a written complaint with the police department or request a supervisor to the scene.
