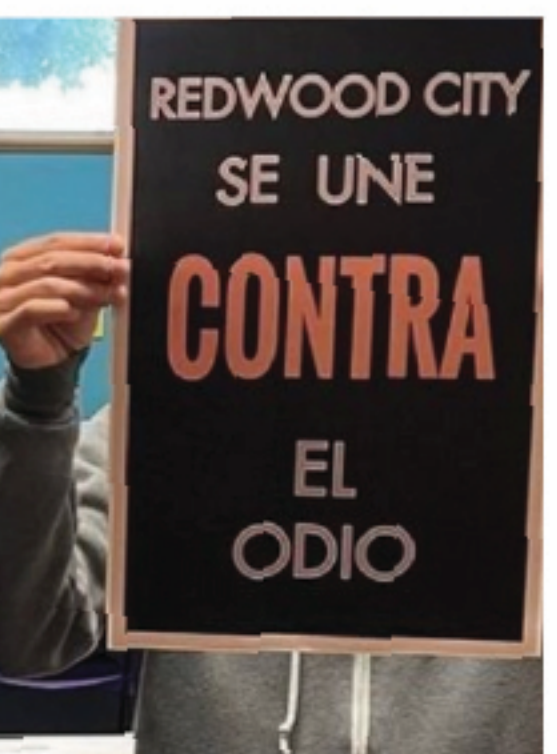
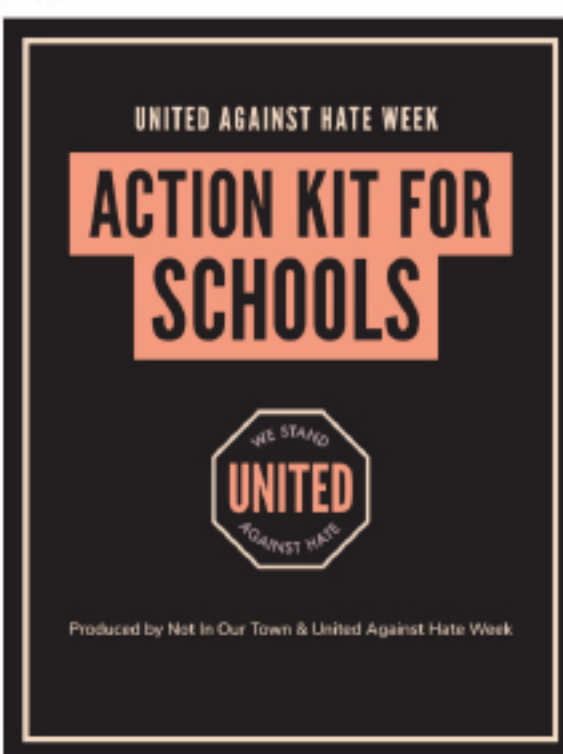
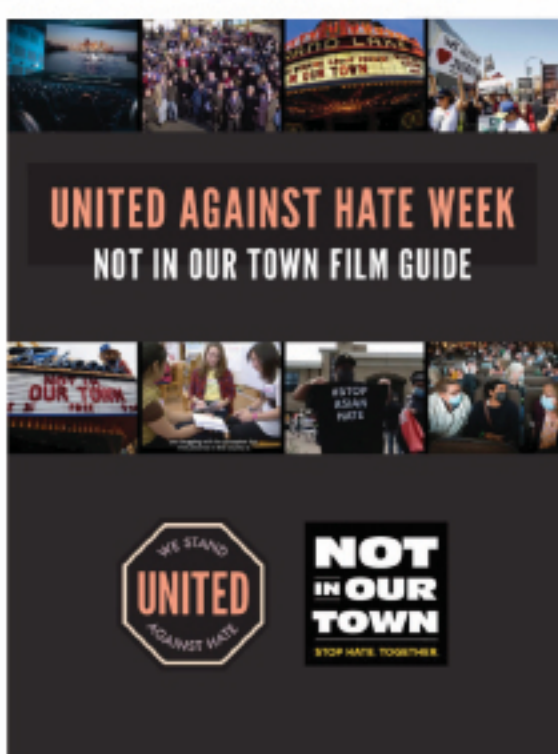
- Build relationships and trust

UAH Week emerged from a poster campaign in 2017 led by Bay Area city leaders who wanted to provide a safe and visible way for residents to respond to the hate groups marching in their cities in the aftermath of the violence in Charlottesville, VA.

Since 2018, the annual campaign has inspired hundreds of communities to host community art projects, unity walks, bystander intervention trainings, block parties, high school game nights, film screenings, interfaith potlucks and more!
